

How to use the MuPAC LaTeX Style

- Your input file should begin with
 - `\documentclass{MuPAC}`
- `\logo{filename.eps}` puts the laboratory logo in `filename.eps` into the upper left corner of every page.
 - This should be before `\begin{document}`
- `\titlepage{Title}{Author}{Institute}{date}` creates a titlepage with the given information. It also sets the running date in the lower left corner to `date`.
 - In most cases, this should be the first command after `\begin{document}`

- `\header{text}` starts a new page and puts `text` at the top of the new page and any subsequent pages, until the next `\header` command
- `\runtitle{text}` sets the text in the running title at the bottom of the page.
 - You should not need to use this for the July 2012 MuPAC

- The `graphicx` (not `graphics`) package is already loaded.
 - `graphicx` and `graphics` are the same, except `graphicx` takes an optional argument with key-value pairs
 - This shouldn't matter unless you are doing something very fancy with included graphics files
- Three additional font sizes are available:
`\large`, `\small`, and `\tiny`
